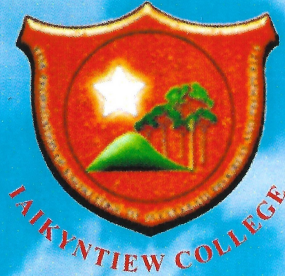

INTRODUCTION

laikyntiew College is an Educational Institution belonging to and managed by the NONGBRI NONGBRI EDUCATION FOUNDATION, which is registered under the Society Act of 1983 (No. E. 16(RS) 30/2001/384).

The College is founded primarily for the upliftment of the students of Meghalaya, but it is open to all students of the North Eastern Region and the country subject to availability of seats irrespective of caste, creed or religion.

The college is having its own building in a spacious campus, located at Rngi Jynriew locality of Nongthymmai at a distance from the bustling highway, which possess an ideal environment for the purpose of teaching and learning.

Qualified teachers are appointed in all faculty and also has an adequate library. For further details please contact the College office or directly with the Principal during office hours.

ADMISSION CRITERIA

Application in prescribed form for admission to the Degree courses in Arts are accepted after the result of the Higher Secondary School Leaving Certificate is published by the Meghalaya Board of School Education and other recognized PLUS TWO LEVEL OF EDUCATION. Application form for admission and prospectus is available in the college Office.

Students who have passed Plus (10+2) or an equivalent examination from any stream from a recognized Board in India/ Abroad has the option to change to Arts Stream.

PROCEDURE

- 1) Application in the prescribed form of admission to the Degree courses should be accompanied with the following testimonials:
 1. Attested copy of Mark sheet obtained in the last examination.
 2. Attested copy of Admit Card of the last examination.
 3. A character certificate from the Principal of school/ college last attended.
 4. Two copies of a recent passport size photograph.
 5. Attested copy of the Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe certificate in case of candidate belonging to this category.
- 2) All original documents are to be produced for inspection at the time of admission. The college reserves the right to refuse any application without assigning any reason for the same.
- 3) Application form should be complete in all aspects. The college reserves the right to refuse incomplete application.
- 4) Candidate should fill up all the information correctly by himself/ herself.
- 5) Students belonging to other Boards/Universities should submit the Original Migration Certificate to the office within one month from the date of admission.

DEGREE COURSES FOR ARTS AFFILIATED TO NEHU

The College is affiliated to the North Eastern Hill University with under Graduate Honours degree under the semester system.

The under Graduate courses offered by the college will be Honours Degree

1. Bachelor of Arts (B.A)

Duration of the Honours Course

1. The honours degree course will comprise of 6 (Six) Semesters spread over 3 (Three) Academic years.
2. Semester means half-yearly programme on term of studies.
3. 1st (First), 3rd (Third) & 5th (Fifth) semester will be Odd Semester.
2nd (Second), 4th (Fourth) & 6th (Sixth) semester will be Even Semester

EXAMINATION

1. At the end of each Semester, there shall be an examination as per the Semester Academic calendar as shown on page 3.

2. Evaluation in each course shall be on the basis of performance through continuous assessment at the end of the semester examinations. The weightage assigned to the continuous assessment and end semester examinations shall be in the ratio 1: 3.
3. The pattern and schedule of continuous assessment and evaluation thereof shall be such as laid down in the relevant Regulation.
4. Student shall be allowed to proceed to the next semester irrespective of failed papers/arrear papers subject to payment of fees and fulfillment of other prescribed conditions laid down by the university.

LIBRARY

GENERAL RULES

1. Attendance is compulsory. A student absenting himself or herself for one or more classes will lose the day's attendance. Students having less than 75% percent attendance are liable to be debarred from examinations. Any student who is absent for more than one month will have his/her name removed from the college register.
2. The college conducts regular tests. The marks secured by the student in these test are taken in to consideration at the time of sending the students to University Examination.
3. Smoking is strictly for bidden in the college campus.
4. Communal harmony is to be preserved, and fostered in words and deeds.
5. Students wishing to take a Transfer Certificate during the year have to clear all college dues up to the end of the academic year.
6. Each student must have College – Identity Card.
